2021 Infrastructure Projects

Please be advised of some upcoming infrastructure work taking place in Middleton beginning mid-July.

Updated information on the start dates for each project will be posted to the Town's website and social media and sent out through our e-newsletter.

Notices will also be delivered to residents and businesses affected by Queen Street prior to the start of work and prior to any service disruptions.

The work will be completed in the following order:

Freeman Street Extension: completion of Freeman Street from Marshall Street/Freeman Street intersection to Veterans Lane.

Main Street/Commercial Street Sidewalk Improvements: the sidewalk ramps at the intersection of Main Street and Commercial Street will be re-aligned to match the crosswalks and tactile plates will be added to improve accessibility.

Queen Street: complete street rebuild including the installation of new water, sewer and storm lines, street paving and mountable curb on the East side.

Check Before You Build

The Town of Middleton wishes to remind residents that development and building permits are required for any construction project, regardless of size.

Whether you are renovating an existing building, building a new house or just putting up a baby barn, you need to obtain a permit before starting the job. Permits are required for small-scale projects such as signs, decks, porches, and garden sheds.

Permits are also required for repairs, alterations, additions, or demolition of existing buildings. Even if no construction occurs, a development permit is needed for a "change of use" such as a new business.
