FROM COUNCIL

- Concerns about local business parking were raised. Signage, and a bylaw were requested to be added to a future agenda.

APPROVED MOTIONS & NEW BUSINESS

- Mayor Smith proclaimed March 26, as “Purple Day” in the Town of Middleton.
- David Wright was appointed as the Town’s Building Official and Fire Inspector.
- Council approved the Town of Middleton’s Loan guarantee resolution to be borrowed by Valley Waste for their 2025/26 capital budget.
- Council approved waiving affordable housing development application fees.
- Council approved a Reservoir Construction Change Order.
- 2026/27 Budget deliberations took place and the budget was approved.
 - The 2026/27 General Operating Budget was approved.
- Council approved the Capital Budget for Town General and Water.
- Council authorized tax rates for 2026/27

APPROVED MOTIONS & NEW BUSINESS

- Council approved maintaining the current tax rates on all properties.
- Council approved the five-year Capital Budget for years 2026-2027 to 2030-2031.
- Council appointed, Jo-Ann Hightower, Janet Davis, and David Britney to the Town’s Police Advisory Board.
- Council appointed Mayor Smith, Councillor Archibald and Councillor Knapp to the Police Advisory Board.
- Councillor Smith will serve in the vacant position on the Audit Committee.
- Councillor Bartlett will serve in the vacant position on the Source Water Protection Advisory Committee.
- Council awarded the RFP for a Climate Risk Assessment to DeWolfe & Morse Surveying Limited.
- Council approved withdrawing from the Valley Regional Enterprise Network.
 - There were lengthy discussions made by Council about the decision.
